Writer's Note

This play began when I heard a radio feature about Chinese tourists reviving a regional Victorian town, drawn to Lake Tyrrell's reflective water and the clear night sky. Being partial to stories of cross-cultural encounters, I decided to take a road trip to Sea Lake, alone. I saw the 'sky mirror' lake for the first time on the day of the Orlando shooting. As I stared at my reflection I was overwhelmed by contradictions: the tragic loss of the lake's original custodians, the Boorong people, in the past; the senseless violence in the present; the straightforward beauty of the Lake holding a promise for the future.

I've been fortunate to workshop Mirror's Edge in MTC's Cybec Electric Programme and through consultations with Wotjobaluk elder Ron Marks. I'm hugely indebted to everyone who patiently offered thoughts and feedback - together we refined eight drafts with five storylines across three centuries into one show. I hope Mirror's Edge will prompt us to reflect (heh) on who we are as a nation. What does it mean for people to come to this land? How might different ways of knowing expand our capacity for empathy? By encountering other cultures, we may learn to see through new eyes.

Writing a story that real people were living has been humbling and rewarding. A day after the cast concluded our excursion to Sea Lake, the State government announceda \$2.3 million grant for infrastructure at Lake Tyrrell. The next day, the Royal Hotel closed up for good after a century of operation. I hope Mirror's Edge can make a positive contribution to the Sea Lake community. Go visit the Lake! It's waiting...
